FOURTH INTERNATIONAL OCEAN DISPOSAL SYMPOSIUM

(11-15 April 1983) Plymouth Polytechnic Plymouth, Devon, England

OBJECTIVE AND SCOPE OF THE SYMPOSIUM

- Provide a periodic forum, once every 18 months, for the exchange of ideas and information among investigators involved in ocean disposal research.
- Enhance the scientific consideration on waste disposal in the marine environment with the production of a symposium volume.
- Generate recommendations and guidelines for future studies on ocean disposal practices.

The 1983 symposium will emphasize processes associated with waste disposal in the marine environment that are important; topics include:

- · Biological effects of wastes in the ocean.
- · Biological accumulation and concentration of
- Dispersion, settling, and transport processes.
- · Fate of radioactive wastes in the ocean.
- · Physical and biochemical modelling on the effect of wastes in the ocean.
- · Availability of pollutants from sediments into hydrosphere and biosphere.
- · Residence time of wastes in the ocean.
- · Scientific strategies for the marine environment.
- · Scientific criteria for site selection and disposal methods.
- Use of microcosms in the investigation of waste disposal.
- · Solution and solid phase physical chemistry of wastes.

The Executive Committee will review the abstracts. Authors will be notified of acceptance/rejection of their abstracts by 31 October 1982. Authors of accepted abstracts will be sent a Guide to Authors, which gives manuscript requirements. Manuscripts must be received by Professor Duedall by 1 March 1983. The symposium manuscripts will be peerreviewed in preparation for publication in a symposium volume. Sessions will consist of presented and poster papers. Authors may indicate their preference.

ACCOMMODATIONS, FEES AND REGISTRATION

The symposium attendees will be housed in the Gilwell House, Plymouth Polytechnic, Plymouth, England. The fees for the symposium are U.S. \$50 for registration, plus U.S. \$200 for accommodations, which include lodging and meals. The rooms are single accommodations only. Because the Gilwell House can accommodate only up to 200 people. authors will have priority on accommodations. After selection of authors, accommodations in the Gilwell House will be based on the order in which symposium application forms are received. Instructions for the payment of fees, which must be paid in advance of the symposium, will be included in a registration packet to be mailed to each attendee in January 1983. Check-in at the Gilwell House will be during the afternoon of 10 April 1983 (Sunday).

Attendees not wishing to stay at the Gilwell House must file an application form and U.S. \$50 registration fee in advance of the symposium. They will also be responsible for making their own meal and housing arrangements in Plymouth.

STUDENT TRAVEL AWARDS

A few student travel awards will be available for serious, studious and worthy students. Candidates for awards should send a letter to Professor Duedall explaining how (s)he would benefit from attending the symposium. The candidate's letter should also include a letter of support from the student's major professor or advisor.


